




Story Behind the Stats

Thornhill riding is bordered by Highway 400, Rutherford Road/Highway 7, Highway 404, and Steeles Avenue East/West. It is divided among parts of the two municipalities of Vaughan and Markham.

Ethnically, this riding has a very diverse population and is home to many racialized communities. It is particularly known for being home to a large Jewish community. A major issue facing residents in the riding, especially those from racialized communities, is a lack of affordable housing. There is a large number of residents who are at risk of losing their homes due to inadequate income to pay their rent or make their mortgage payments.

Taking Action in Thornhill

Jewish Family and Child Services (JF&CS) reaches into every corner of our community with services that identify and meet the evolving needs of our residents with an emphasis on the area's strong and growing Jewish population. In the Greater Toronto Area, more than 22,000 Jews live in poverty. This represents 40% of Canada's Jewish poor.

Within our own local community, many children, Jews and non-Jews alike, are being raised below the poverty line. The single most significant shortfall in the struggle against poverty continues to be affordable or subsidized housing. Responding to current economic conditions and the financial needs of families, JF&CS provides an assistance program to ensure a quality of life for those within our community that reflects integrity and self-respect. Through the United Jewish Appeal Federation of Greater Ontario, under its Supplementary Financial Assistance Program (SFAP), individuals and families can receive a basic income supplement each month. Any person living in the Greater Toronto Area whose income is derived from social assistance, family benefits, Employment Insurance, Old Age Pension or low wages may apply for this assistance.

A major consequence of living in poverty is family stress so JF&CS provides a broad range of services to children under 16 years of age and their families. These services include preventive and support programs that aim to strengthen and rehabilitate families.
